Laws and Regulations

Civil Penalty and Restitution

If on operator is convicted of the offenses listed under the heading "Unlawful Operation", additional penalties and restitution can be added to the criminal charges. See lowa Code Section 3211.15A for more details.

Negligence

The owner and operator of an OHV are liable for any injury or damage occasioned by the negligent operation of the vehicle. The owner of an OHV shall be liable for any such injury or damage only if the owner was the operator of the vehicle at the time the injury or damage occurred or if the operator had the owner's consent to operate the vehicle at the time the injury or damage occurred.

Officer's Signal to Stop

A person who has received a visual or audible signal from a peace officer to come to a stop shall not operate an OHV in willful or wanton disregard of the signal, interfere with or endanger the officer or any other person or vehicle, increase speed, or attempt to flee or elude the officer.

Inspections - Warnings - Termination of Use

A peace officer may stop and inspect an OHV operated, parked, or stored on public streets, highways, public lands, or frozen waters of the state to determine if the vehicle is registered, numbered, or equipped as required by the Code of Iowa and the Iowa Administrative Code. The officer shall not inspect an area that is not essential to determine compliance with the requirements. If the officer determines that the vehicle is not in compliance, the officer may issue a warning memorandum to the operator and forward a copy to the DNR. The warning memorandum shall indicate the items found which are not in compliance and shall direct the owner or operator of the vehicle to correct these items and return a copy of the warning memorandum with the proof of compliance to the DNR within 14 days. If the proof of compliance is not provided within 14 days, the owner or operator is in violation of Iowa Code Chapter 3211.

A person who receives a warning memorandum for an OHV shall stop using the vehicle as soon as possible and shall not operate it on public streets, highways, public lands, or frozen waters of the state until the vehicle is in compliance.


Laws and Regulations

Operation on Roadways and Highways

- A person shall not operate an OHV upon roadways or highways except as provided in lowa Code Section 321.234A and lowa Code Section 321.10.
- A registered OHV may be operated on the designated portions of county highways as determined by the county board of supervisors for such use during a specified period of time. In designating such roadways, the board may authorize vehicles to stop at service stations or convenience stores along a designated roadway.
- Cities may designate streets under the jurisdiction of cities within their respective corporate limits which may be used for the operation of registered OHVs. In designating such streets, the city may authorize vehicles to stop at service stations or convenience stores along a designated street.
- An ATV or an ORV may make a direct crossing of a highway provided all of the following occur:
- The crossing is made at an angle of approximately ninety degrees to the direction of the highway and at a place where no obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing.
- The ATV or ORV is brought to a complete stop before crossing the shoulder or main traveled way of the highway.
- The driver yields the right-of-way to all oncoming traffic which constitutes an immediate hazard.
- In crossing a divided highway, the crossing is made only at an intersection of such highway with another public street or highway.
- The crossing is made from a street, roadway, or highway designated as an ATV trail by a state agency, county, or city to a street, roadway, or highway designated as an ATV trail by a state agency, county, or city.

Use on Snowmobile Trails

OHVs are not allowed to be operated on snowmobile trails except where designated by the controlling authority and the primary snowmobile trail sponsor.

DRAINAGE REVIEW

Steve requested ISG review surface water runoff from the Community United Presbyterian Church, how to contain runoff and mitigate any possible future damage to the property at the southwest corner of E. Paint Street and N. Washington St.. Runoff from the church parking lot is flowing across E. Paint St. and causing erosion and flooding along the rear of this property. He requested that ISG review possible options to contain the flow of water to the north right of way along E. Paint St.

Currently surface water flows south and east across the church parking lot, into a small ditch along the north side of E. Paint. St., continues to flow east to N. Washington St. where is enters a street culvert and flows south along the west side of N. Washington St. where it enters a culvert and flows south. During high storm events, the surface water flows across E. Paint street and bypasses the small ditch.

ISG looked into 3 possible options to alleviate the surface water flow across E. Paint St. as follows: Install Curb and Gutter along the church parking lot, install curb and gutter along the south side of E. Paint Street and install a trench drain along the church parking lot. With any of these options, it is also recommended that the City increase the cross slope (crown) of this road during a future road maintenance project. The preliminary recommendation is that a trench drain be installed to collect the storm water and discharge into the drainage ditch. Trench drain construction is estimated at \$2,500-3,500 plus the possible addition of the outlet pipe.

See attached plan sheet for installing a trench drain on the road adjacent to the far south east corner of the parking lot. This trench drain runs 16' long, has a 1' width, and has a 1' depth. From preliminary design calculations, we estimate that this trench drain will capture between 80-90% of all surface water from the runoff area on the attached plan sheet.

The stormwater captured by the trench drain will flow east into the drainage way north of the road. There are two options to discharge the water into the ditch. Option 1 is for the trench drain to have an open face on its east side. This will allow water to flow freely into the ditch. Option 2 is to install a 20' section of pipe on the east end of the trench drain running east. This option keeps the water in a controlled system longer and allows the water to get to a steeper ditch section before it is discharged.

To aid in direction water that is not captured by the trench drain, we recommend that the crown of the road be raised. This will not only prevent water from running across the road, but also direct the water towards the intake before discharging into the drainage ditch.



Mayor Petry welcomed guests and opened floor for public comment; no public comment.

REPORTS: Reports were given by Mayor Petry, Public Works Senior Eckert, council committee member Smith, and council committee member Sophia Eckert.

<u>OLD/UNFINISHED BUSINESS:</u> Council discussed three possible options for the new sewer lagoon project. Snyder & Associates provided cost analysis and effluent limits for each option. Discussed sewer rate increases and possible hardship on citizens. Mayor Petry to inquire options with public finance firm. Council to hold town hall meeting in October to present information to citizens.

NEW COUNCIL BUSINESS: Motion by Goldsberry, seconded by Cark to transfer \$86,004.06 from the General Fund to the Local Option Sales & Service Fund; motion carried unanimously by roll call vote. CHAPTER 120

BEER, LIQUOR AND WINE CONTROL

120.01 General Prohibition 120.02 Persons Under Legal Age 120.03 Public Consumption or Intoxication

120.04 Open Container on Streets and Highways 120.05 License or Permit Required

120.01 GENERAL PROHIBITION. It is unlawful to manufacture for sale, sell, offer or keep for sale, possess, or transport alcoholic liquor, wine, or beer except upon terms, conditions, limitations, and restrictions enumerated in State law and this Code of Ordinances.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 123.2)

- 120.02 PERSONS UNDER LEGAL AGE. As used in this section, "legal age" means twenty-one (21) years of age or more.
 - 1. A person or persons under legal age shall not purchase or attempt to purchase or individually or jointly have alcoholic liquor, wine or beer in their possession or control; except in the case of liquor, wine or beer given or dispensed to a person under legal age within a private home and with the knowledge, presence and consent of the parent or guardian, for beverage or medicinal purposes or as administered to the person by either a physician or dentist for medicinal purposes and except to the extent that a person under legal age may handle alcoholic beverages, wine, and beer during the regular course of the person's employment by a liquor control licensee, or wine or beer permittee under State laws.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 123.47[2])

2. A person under legal age shall not misrepresent the person's age for the purpose of purchasing or attempting to purchase any alcoholic beverage, wine or beer from any licensee or permittee.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 123.49[3])

120.03 PUBLIC CONSUMPTION OR INTOXICATION.

- 1. As used in this section unless the context otherwise requires:
 - A. "Arrest" means the same as defined in section 804.5 of the Code of Iowa and includes taking into custody pursuant to section 232.19 of the Code of Iowa.
 - B. "Chemical test" means a test of a person's blood, breath, or urine to determine the percentage of alcohol present by a qualified person using devices and methods approved by the Commissioner of Public Safety.

- C. "Peace Officer" means the same as defined in section 801.4 of the Code of Iowa.
- D. "School" means a public or private school or that portion of a public or private school which provides teaching for any grade from kindergarten through grade twelve.
- 2. A person shall not use or consume alcoholic liquor, wine or beer upon the public streets or highways. A person shall not use or consume alcoholic liquor in any public place, except premises covered by a liquor control license. A person shall not possess or consume alcoholic liquors, wine or beer on public school property or while attending any public or private school-related function. A person shall not be intoxicated or simulate intoxication in a public place. A person violating this subsection is guilty of a simple misdemeanor.
- 3. When a peace officer arrests a person on a charge of public intoxication under this section, the peace officer shall inform the person that the person may have a chemical test administered at the person's own expense. If a device approved by the Commissioner of Public Safety for testing a sample of a person's breath to determine the person's blood alcohol concentration is available, that is the only test that need be offered the person arrested. In a prosecution for public intoxication, evidence of the results of a chemical test performed under this subsection is admissible upon proof of a proper foundation. The percentage of alcohol present in a person's blood, breath, or urine established by the results of a chemical test performed within two hours after the person's arrest on a charge of public intoxication is presumed to be the percentage of alcohol present at the time of arrest.

120.04 OPEN CONTAINER ON STREETS AND HIGHWAYS. (See Section 62.10 of this Code of Ordinances.)

120.05 LICENSE OR PERMIT REQUIRED. It is unlawful for any person to manufacture for sale, sell, offer or keep for sale, possess or transport alcoholic liquor, wine or beer without first securing a liquor control license, wine permit or beer permit in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 123 of the Code of Iowa.

State Regulation of Golf Carts

Under Code of lowa Section 321.247 golf carts:

- Are not required to be registered or licensed by the lowa Department of Transportation (DOT).
- Can operate on city streets only if allowed to do so by the city council.
- Are not allowed to operate on a city street which is a primary road extension through the city but are allowed to cross a primary road extension.
- Can operate on city streets only from sunrise to sunset.
- Must be equipped with adequate brakes, a slow moving vehicle sign and a bicycle safety flag.
- Must meet such other safety requirements as the city may impose.

Under Code Section 321.174 it is unlawful for anyone to operate a "motor vehicle", including a golf cart, upon streets and highways unless the operator has a valid driver's license.

Under Section 321.20B golf carts cannot be operated on highways or city streets unless financial liability coverage (insurance) is in effect for the vehicle and the driver has proof of insurance in his/her possession.

City Regulation of Golf Carts

Many city ordinances simply mirror the basic requirements found in Section 321.247 of the Code, while other cities have chosen to more closely regulate or be more innovative in regulating the use of their streets by golf carts.

City Permit Required

Several cities require that before a golf cart can be operated on city streets, the owner must obtain a permit from the city and pay a permit fee. As a condition for issuance of a permit some cities require one or more of the following:

- That the golf cart be inspected.
- That the owner show proof of financial liability coverage.
- That the operator has a valid lowa driver's license.

Some cities also require either that the permit be carried on the golf cart when it is operated on city streets or that the permit sticker be displayed on the golf cart.

Areas Where Golf Cart Operation is Allowed

Cities that regulate golf carts typically regulate where golf carts are allowed to operate, repeating the state law prohibition against golf carts operating on city streets that are also state highways and listing one or more additional streets where golf cart operation is either authorized or prohibited. Some cities allow golf cart operation on restricted streets by community and civic organizations for community events including parades.

Additional Limitations on Operation of Golf Carts

Cities have also imposed additional prohibitions on the operation of golf carts, including prohibition of:

- Operation on public sidewalks, the area between the sidewalk and the curb line and in cemeteries.
- Operation on private property without the consent of the property owner.
- Operation on city streets during inclement weather.
- Operation in a careless, reckless or negligent manner.

- Operation while under the influence of intoxicating liquor, narcotics or habit forming drugs.
- Carrying more than two riders in the front seat, or more than two riders in the back seat if a back seat is provided.
- Towing of any item by a golf cart.
- Modification of a golf cart for increased speed.

State Regulation of ATVs and Snowmobiles

The state legislature has enacted two very similar statutes, Chapter 321I regulating ATVs and Chapter 321G regulating snowmobiles.

Under the provisions of Chapter 321I, an ATV is required to be registered with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) and the registration and non-resident user permit decais must be displayed on the machine. The state code details several requirements of ATV operators:

- Must have a user permit from the IDNR (including non-resident users).
- Must possesses a valid driver's license in order to operate an ATV on streets and highways.
- Who is 12 years old but less than 18 must have and display an education certificate issued by the DNR.
- Can operate only on those city streets which have been designated for such use by the city council.
- Is not allowed to carry a passenger unless the ATV is designed to carry passengers.
- Is not allowed to operate on a city street which is a primary highway and can only cross a city street that is a state highway with the permission of the DOT.

Under the provisions of Chapter 321G a snowmobile is required to be registered in the name of the owner with the DNR and be issued a user permit, and the registration and permit decals must be displayed on the machine. According to the Code, snowmobile operators must:

- Must have a user permit from the IDNR.
- Age 16 and above, who possess a valid driver's license and an education certificate, may operate on their own.
- Ages 12 through 17 must have and display an education certificate.
- Ages 12 through 15 must be under direct supervision of an adult.
- Under age 12 must be accompanied on the same machine by a licensed adult.
- Can operate only on those city streets which have been designated for such use by the city council.
- Are not allowed to operate on a city street which is a primary highway but are allowed to cross a primary highway.

Under Section 321.20B, ATVs and snowmobiles cannot be operated on highways or city streets unless financial liability coverage (insurance) is in effect for the vehicle and the driver has proof of insurance in his/her possession. Also, state law allows cities to adopt ordinances relating to the operation or equipping of ATVs and snowmobiles, provided that such ordinances are not inconsistent with those chapters of the Code or with the implementing administrative rules adopted by the IDNR.

City Regulation of ATVs and Snowmobiles

Who May Operate an ATV or Snowmobile within the City

Some cities require that ATV and snowmobile operators must possess a valid lowa driver's license, and/or that they be of a minimum required age as determined by the city.

Areas Where Operation of ATVs and Snowmobiles is Allowed

A number of cities have adopted very similar provisions allowing ATVs and snowmobiles to:

- Be operated on such streets as may be designated by resolution of the council.
- Be operated within the right-of-way of an operating railroad.
- Cross a railroad right-of-way, but only at an established crossing and using the improved portion of the crossing after yielding to all oncoming traffic.

Those ordinances also typically prohibit the operation of ATVs and snowmobiles:

In any park, playground or upon any other city-owned property without the express permission of the city.

- on public sidewalks, in the area between the sidewalk and the curb line, and in cemeteries.
- On any prohibited street except during emergencies (e.g. during the period of time when and at locations where snow upon the roadway renders travel by conventional motor vehicles impractical and unsafe) or when plowing snow.
- On private property without the consent of the property owner.

Some cities also prohibit the operation of ATVs and snowmobiles:

- At a speed in excess of 25 miles per hour.
- e In a careless, reckless or negligent manner.
- While under the influence of intoxicating liquor, narcotics or habit forming drugs.
- In the area surrounding a hospital.
- In the area surrounding any school from one hour before to one hour after the time school is in session.
- In the area surrounding any church from on-half hour before to one-half hour after any church services.

City officials are encouraged to consult with their city attorney to develop city code provisions regulating the operation of these vehicles and to engage with their citizens throughout the process to ensure the community is aware of regulations being adopted.
