Attendees present in person or via video: Mayor Kandi S. Petry, Council Members: Sophia Eckert, Mark Goldsberry, Andrea Jors, Haldean Wilson and Rhonda Lanphier. City staff - Clerk Cynthia Crippen, Public Works Senior - Steve Eckert, Fire Chief Dave Dushane and ISG – Lenny Larson were also in attendance.

Mayor Petry called the meeting to order at 5:52 P.M. Voluntary Pledge of Allegiance recited.  
Motion by Eckert, seconded by Wilson approving agenda items. Motion carried 4-0

**OLD/UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Consideration & Possible Action**

- a. **George St. Parking** – Council discussed the on-going issues with school parents parking on George St. Sheriff Carico will attend the December meeting to discuss this matter further.
- b. **SRF Plan Discussion** – ISG went over the project schedule and determined the 3 possible locations that would benefit being 1) Alley by the Storage Units (2) Dayton & Vine intersection (3) Church
- c. **WWTP Electrical Service** – Motion by Eckert, seconded by Wilson to approve the Waste Water Treatment Plant MidAmerican electrical upgrade of \$38,206.35 to be paid from the Sewer fund. Motion carried 5-0
- d. **GEMT – Medicaid Reimbursement Agreement** – Fire Chief DuShane II and Clerk will do some more research to present to Council.

**NEW COUNCIL BUSINESS: Consideration & Possible Action**

- a. **Budget Time Line** – Clerk presented the Budget Time line with 1 Special Meeting January 24, 2023.
- b. **Procedures & Appointments** - Council reviewed the changes and a Resolution will be added to the December 20, 2022 Agenda.
- c. **Salaries and Hourly Wages for City Employees for Fiscal Year July1, 2023 Through June 30, 2024** – Council determined a cost of living of 3.2% raise for the City Employees and a Resolution will be added to the December 20, 2022 Agenda.

**GENERAL COUNCIL DISCUSSION:** Public Works informed council that the back road to the Lagoon was re-graveled by the County and Goldsberry discussed concerns regarding the City being billed for the dog issue.
